Michael Callahan is chief technologist for enterprise network-attached storage (NAS) in the StorageWorks division, which is part of the Enterprise Servers and Storage business unit at HP. He is responsible for the technical direction of the company's enterprise file-based storage products, including the HP StorageWorks 4400 Scalable NAS File Services and the HP StorageWorks 9100 Extreme Data Storage System.

Previously, Callahan was chief technology officer and a co-founder of PolyServe, which was acquired by HP in April 2007. PolyServe's market-leading file serving and database clustering solutions were deployed at more than 500 customers worldwide, supporting numerous mission-critical applications in government and Global 2000 enterprises.

Before PolyServe, Callahan ran an advanced development group at Ask Jeeves, an Internet search engine that became the fourth most trafficked search engine after Google, Yahoo and Microsoft. Previously, he was a mathematician doing research in differential geometry, topology and computer vision.
